## Father's Corner

- ✚ As we can see, every Sunday in September and October is without a host/sponsor for the Sunday Coffee Social. ☹️ As I have said many times, "Coffee is good for the soul after church on Sunday." It gives us a great reason to just enjoy some fellowship.
- ✚ There is a change in the Church Office Hours. I will be in the office Monday thru Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If I don't answer the phone that means I am out on a parish call. If you would like to stop by the office, call first to make sure I am in, but if my auto is in the church parking lot, I am there. Please come in. The coffee pot is on and I usually have some goodies tucked away somewhere.
- ✚ And speaking about being out of the office, Joanne and I will be on vacation from Sunday afternoon, Sept. 17 thru Saturday, September 23rd. I will be in Church to celebrate Holy Liturgy on Sunday September 17th. Joanne and I will be hitting the road after Church.
- ✚ I hope you have noticed that the much needed tuck pointing of the church has been completed. At the previous General Assembly we approved the spending of at least \$10,000 for that project alone but we were able to have the entire tuck pointing project done for about \$4,200 and change. Our next project is the renovation of the parish hall. As we say in Greek, "KALI ARHI", OR GREAT BEGINNING.
- ✚ I would bet the ranch that you would like to know how we did at Greekfest this year. Well, we did great. Our total gross sales for the three days was a record \$90,018.67. \$90,000 Dollars. Holy Cow!!! Our total expenses amounted to \$41,758 + change, which gave us a net profit of \$48,260 + change. Our percentage of net profit against gross sales was 55%, which is very good. In the business of church festivals the benchmark is to make a net profit of 50%. We topped that by 5%, which means we had a record-setting year in sales. Our food costs increased because we added some items: corn, cheese curds, strawberry/yogurt desserts and we had some additional equipment costs, like the rental of the corn roaster. Our newly Chrismated Saint Spyridon member, Ryan Scannell, donated over four cases of cheese curds. However, we needed to order more cases. Also our food costs increased this year without us increasing prices. Food costs are determined by what it costs the farmer for feed, fuel and equipment plus what it costs him/her to maintain their farm and equipment. Those increases are passed on to the distributor, in our case Midwest Foods and or Gordon Foods. The distributor's cost of distributing to his/her customers are determined by the cost of transport and delivery and those are passed on to the customer. Maybe we need to revisit our pricing structure, but that is for next year. What is most important is that we had a banner year but together by a tremendous group of committee people headed by our Parish Council President, Dr. John Revelis and supported by you the tremendous Saint Spyridon Greek Orthodox Family. Thank you and God Bless and KAI TOU HRONOU!!!
- ✚ We also want to say a special thank you to Mike & Mary Holden, Mary for organizing a great outing to the Fireside Theater to see the very funny stage play, CHURCH WOMEN IN THE BASEMENT. The lunch was great, the play was very entertaining. It kind of reminded me of us, in a very good way, and the fellowship was tremendous. And Mike made a great driver of the 15 passenger bus that was loaned to us by son Robb Holden. Thank you all and GOD BLESS.
- ✚ Our fall Gyro Fry this year will be on Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. A sign-up sheet will be put up in the parish hall, so you can choose when you would like to help out. We will need people from 9am – 11am to set

up. We will need servers, runners and fryers for two shifts, 11-3 and 3-6 (which includes a little clean-up.) Please show your support of this event by offering your time and talent. Many thanks in advance!!

✚ On September 1st we begin a new Ecclesiastical Year in the Orthodox World. It is a new ecclesiastical beginning for all of us. We have had growth in many respects over the past couple of years and we owe that to Dr. John Revelis and the fine men and women on our Saint Spyridon Parish Council. These men and women are committed to the continuous growth and development of our fine parish in all respects, spiritual, social, and of course in the matters of finance. As we begin this new spiritual year I pray that we will continue to grow in membership, church attendance and in our spiritual development.

✚ We have grown in leaps in terms of our Stewardship Commitments. We have about 85 families, both here locally, in the Milwaukee, Green Bay, and Chicago areas, and in the states of Georgia, Minnesota and Washington, DC, who are contributing Stewards because we all love our Saint Spyridon Parish. As we come closer to the end of this Ecclesiastical year, let's make sure that we complete our Stewardship commitment that we made at the start of 2017 and let's start thinking about our Stewardship commitment for 2018. That's it. Thank you so much for your constant support in so many ways and God Bless!!!! Always.
